Dr. LaVernia Jorgensen:

The Dr. LaVernia Jorgensen Memorial Professional Development Scholarship is named for an influential professional in the field of parks and recreation in North Dakota. Dr. Jorgensen was born in Luck, Wis., received her bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, master's degree from the University of Minnesota, and doctorate from Indiana University. She taught at the University of North Dakota from 1963-1988 as a professor of recreation and remained active in NDRPA until her death on Sept. 23, 2009.

Professional Development Scholarship Criteria:

NDRPA has scholarships available for professionals who seek to enhance their knowledge through professional certifications, conference, advanced degrees, or other learning opportunities. Selection of recipients will be based on demonstrated professional achievement, commitment to the field and educational pursuit. NDRPA will award monetary scholarships up to \$1,000 annually on a reimbursement basis after required documentation is submitted. Examples of professional development that may be supported include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Certifications such as CPRP, CPSI, etc.
- NDRPA State Conference or other training
- NRPA Annual Conference or other training

Eligibility Criteria:

- Must be a full-time professional in a recreation/leisure/natural resource/tourism service position for at least one year (may be nonconsecutive 12 months for seasonal positions).
- Must be a NDRPA member in good standing.
- Preference will be given to applicants who are members of NRPA at the time of application.

Application Deadline:

Completed applications must be received by Nov. 1, 2020. Successful candidates will be invited to attend the 2021 NDRPA State Conference & Awards Banquet Sept. 13-15 in Bismarck, N.D., where they will be awarded their scholarships.
